

## Community Meeting #1 Summary


- A future vision for the campus.

# Healthy Community Goals

## Preliminary Findings

- Harbor-UCLA plays a critical role in meeting the health care needs of the people of South Los Angeles
- Greater public awareness of health and wellness is needed in the community as rates of obesity and diabetes continue to increase
- An opportunity exists for Harbor-UCLA to improve coordination efforts with its own health centers, other Los Angeles County health centers, and FQHCs





## South Bay Service Planning Area SPA 8

### Service Area: Los Angeles County South Bay Service Planning Area

- Los Angeles County is divided into eight service planning areas (SPAs)
- Harbor-UCLA is located in South Bay Service Planning Area (SPA) 8, which includes Harbor, Inglewood, Long Beach, and Torrance.


# South Bay Population

## 2000 to 2010 Population Change

- Los Angeles County grew 3.1% from 2000 to 2010, representing an increase of approximately 300,000 people.

Adjacent to Harbor-UCLA's service area:

- Torrance added +7,5000
- Carson added + 2,000
- Lomita added +200



# South Bay Population Health

In the South Bay Region, life expectancy is among the lowest for those living east and north of Harbor-UCLA compared to other Los Angeles County cities


## Life Expectancy (Years) by City

## South Bay Population Health

- Obesity rose 14.3% to 22.2% from 1997-2007
- Diabetes rose 6.6 % to 9.1% from 1997-2007
- Childhood obesity rates range from 12% to 29% in the South Bay regions east and north of Harbor-UCLA Medical Center.
