## **BOARD APPROVES \$100,000 REWARD MOTION BY RIDLEY-THOMAS AND ANTONOVICH FOR THE CAPTURE OF CHRISTOPHER DORNER**

In an effort to expedite the capture of suspected murderer Christopher Jordan Dorner, the former Los Angeles Police Department officer wanted for killing three people last week, the Board of Supervisors unanimously approved a motion by Supervisor Michael D. Antonovich and Board Chairman Mark Ridley-Thomas offering a \$100,000-reward for information leading to his arrest.

Dorner, 33, is wanted for killing 28-year-old Monica Quan and her fiancé, 27-year-old Keith Lawrence, as well as Riverside Police Officer, Michael Crain, 34. The bodies of Quan and Lawrence were found in a parking structure in Irvine on Feb. 3, and it is believed they were targeted by Dorner as an act of revenge against Quan's father, a former LAPD captain. Crain was killed while on patrol in Riverside last Thursday.

"We want to end this manhunt, help bring closure to the families of the victims, and restore public safety," said Supervisor Ridley-Thomas. "It is our hope that this reward will encourage the public to come forward."

"This deadly rampage has caused a significant threat to public safety and direct threat to law enforcement," added Supervisor Antonovich.

Dorner posted a 14-page manifesto with a 50-person hit list on the internet.

The motion comes after an ongoing and unprecedented search for Dorner. Local law enforcement have reported him as armed and dangerous.
